Scenario # 1

On a campout, an unopened can of beans has exploded in the campfire. A scout who was standing nearby has been injured and has tripped over the fire ring and is on the ground conscious and lying on his back. He has second-degree burns on the left side of his face from the hot beans. He has a deep cut through his left eyebrow that is bleeding slowly but steadily. When he tripped and fell, his left arm was broken between the wrist and elbow.

Treat and Transport.

Scenario # 1 Judges Notes

Anticipated Order of Treatment:

- Send two scouts for help
- Suggested Treatment order
 1. Treat for shock by elevating legs and covering with blanket.
 2. Scouts providing treatment need to apply gloves.
 3. Cool burn with cool water.
 4. Apply pressure to cut, dress the cut and apply cravat bandage to stabilize dressing.
 5. Apply moist dressing to the second-degree burn and cover with a second dressing. Secure dressings using a cravat bandage.
 6. Splint left arm and apply sling to the extremity.
 7. Transport this scout using the stretcher by log rolling the scout onto the stretcher and covering to continue to treat for shock.

Notes to Judges:

The key factors in this scenario are the burn, bleeding, and shock. The broken arm is secondary but still must be treated. Watch for treatment of shock and rough handling during elevation of legs.

NOTE: When scoring, for each point reduction, circle the point reduction corresponding to the deficiency. For example, if you witness 'Rough Handling', circle the '5pts' box next to 'Rough Handling'.
